Kia ora e te whānau

Term 1 is well underway and I trust all the Year 5-8 students are getting all organised for camp next week! Year 4s will also be out and about doing a range of learning activities outside the classroom, so it will be very quiet here at school for the Juniors.

2024 brings a change of focus for policy direction from the government, with 3 key actions within the first 100 days. Having said that, these will not be very different for our school.

- As per my email earlier this year, cell phones and smart watches with communication capabilities are not
 allowed to be used by students whilst on school grounds. This is no different from our previous procedures
 (see note later in newsletter for procedures). If students need to get hold of you during the school day or vice
 versa, communication goes through the office.
- We are keeping abreast of guidance about the 'hour a day' for reading, writing and maths. Teachers at our school are already very focused on making sure reading, writing and maths are taught thoroughly and we work hard to make sure students are secure in their knowledge. It is important to note that authentic learning is important and we try to bring reading, writing and maths to life in real life contexts, integrated into other learning areas. This allows us to provide a balanced, rich, curriculum that supports students develop foundation learning skills and broaden their horizons and understandings.
- The curriculum is already being refreshed and we are continuing with our professional development for teachers on this. The refreshed curriculum is more specific, providing greater clarity about what should be taught at each level. As this is further reviewed, we will continue to learn about and implement new content.

You will have seen my message around road safety in the first week of the term. The Board reviewed some suggested alterations to road markings from the council at our February meeting. There are plans to reduce the speed around the school and we are in conversation with them about how we can work together to improve safety. It is really important that we are all vigilant in order to keep our children safe. A few key messages:

- walk or scooter to school if at all possible
- park and stop legally pay attention to, and abide with, road signs and markings
- if you drop your child on the opposite side of Spinnaker Drive, we encourage them to use the underpass as this is the safest way to cross the road.

If any parents are keen to volunteer time at pick up or drop off to help encourage safety, please let me know.

Our new school structure seems to be working well so far. There is certainly a happy buzz of learning around the school. I hope you get a sense that your child is settled and enjoying school. Please remember that if you have any questions, concerns or celebrations to share with us, we welcome your communication.

Attendance

If a student misses one day of school every two weeks, they miss a whole year of school by 16 years of age. As a parent or caregiver, you, alongside our school, play a key role in building strong habits of regular school attendance.

All students are legally required to attend school every day and it is a shared responsibility to make sure students attend and engage in learning from when they first start school. As we enter 2024, every day of school matters. You must let the school know if your child is going to be absent for a day or intends to be absent for a portion of the school term for whatever reason, like a tangi or medical procedure. Family holidays or taking time off for extracurricular activities (not organised by school) are not acceptable reasons for being absent.

If you're struggling at home with getting your child to school, talk to us! Our school is committed to supporting your child to attend school and building a culture that fosters excellent attendance by having:

- School staff who have strong relationships with students and whānau.
- A school culture that recognises your child and your family for who they are, where they come from and who they want to be.
- A school community that does everything to make sure students are at school, and they are participating, and progressing in their education.

Vision Update

This year we are continuing to develop a new school vision that reflects the "why we come to school". We will use the thoughts from our board, and parents' viewpoints from last year as a starting point and begin exploring these key words and ideas with our tamariki. We are excited for where this learning will take us and hope to present some vision statements co-constructed with our learners later in the year. Phones & Electronic Messaging Devices

Just a reminder that while students can bring their phones to school, they do so at their own risk and they are not to be used during the school day. In rare instances you need to contact your child during the day or vice versa, all communication goes through the office. We have noted an increased number of children with smart watches - the same applies and any messaging capability should be turned off during the day. If students use devices, they will be taken off them, given to Kaylene and given back at the end of the day. If use is repeated, the device will be held at school for collection by parents.

Sunhats/pōtae

Being sun smart at Discovery School is very important. All children need to wear a sunhat everyday in term 1 and term 4. We encourage each child to keep a named sunhat either in their school bag or tote tray so that they can be outside during school hours safely. We advise parents to apply sunscreen to their children before school, and then ask your child to reapply it at lunchtime as the weather can be hot at this time of the year.

Nut Free

We have some children with allergies to nuts and nut products. For these children their allergies are life threatening, therefore we ask that all nut products are left out of school lunches. Please pay attention to this when purchasing items for school lunches and when filling your child's lunchbox. Your consideration of this is greatly appreciated.

Punctuality

We understand that mornings can be very busy for all families and getting to school can be, at times, a major undertaking. The beginning of the day is an important time aimed at helping students settle in, therefore it is important to ensure your child arrives at school between 8.30 am and 8:55 am each day. By arriving in plenty of time, children have the opportunity to connect with their peers and teacher and to get themselves organised for the day ahead. When students arrive late, they take longer to settle into the classroom and disrupt the learning that is taking place.

Can you please ensure your child has everything they need for the day in their bag. While we do understand that from time to time, things get forgotten, we have a large number of students at school and it is not possible for the office staff to deliver items to the classrooms if they have been forgotten.

Parking, Drop off and Pick up

Please ensure you are obeying all parking signs and regulations when you drop off and collect your children from school. A reminder that on both Spinnaker Drive and The Companionway, there are parking restrictions, particularly around pick up and drop off times. All parents and caregivers are legally obliged to follow the rules around parking, which are in place to keep everyone safe.

Annual Charges/Donations/Emergency Contact Details

The annual charges, donations have been added to the Musac Edge portal. You can either pay through the portal using a credit card (surcharge applies) or pay directly into the school bank account (account details are on the stationery lists).

Have you downloaded the EDGE app for parents?

You can now inform the office of absences via the app and it is super easy. We really encourage parents to use the app for absence notification if you can as it logs directly into the attendance register, which will assist with efficiency and accuracy at our end!

Access to the edge caregiver portal and app uses the existing email address that Discovery School has on record. This App allows you to view school information about your child(ren), notify the school of absences and view and pay school bills online (note there is a small surcharge for credit card payments). It gives you quick and easy access to the information for students in your household. Once you are in, click on 'notify school of absence' and follow the prompts. If your child is away sick, we do need the type of illness/reason noted. If you have any questions, please contact the office.
