# Mai te pene a te Tumuaki | From the Principals' Pen

I had an amazing time on the **Principal's Study Tour in Finland** and I want to start by thanking the Board for their support and the staff for their work in keeping everything running smoothly while I was away (in particular, Sarah Jenner who acted as principal). I always find visiting schools to be really interesting and I learn heaps from school visits. Visiting schools in a different country takes it to the next level. There are a number of differences in our systems which the NZ contingent were very jealous of (all aspects of education being free right through to tertiary for a start), but there were plenty of take outs and learnings that I will share with the board and staff.

One noticeable thing from a parenting perspective, was how independent the children were with managing their basic needs, from a young age (in the preschool centres). The expectations were clear to the children and adults talked them through challenges rather than doing things for them. There were certainly no adults doing up zips or carrying children's bags! There were differences and similarities in the learning programmes, but in Finland, there were less differences between schools. You can see from the photo, I enjoyed playing on the ECE playground!







We went into the woods one evening, where we had to light our own fires to cook our meal - I'm sure you can imagine I was a bit out of my comfort zone, but those are my hands in the photo using the flint and a good pic of me bush bashing our way back afterwards! We also visited Nexus International School in Singapore on our way home. It was a very different school again, with a privatised funding system, but the programmes were very similar to NZ classrooms and I know where a lot of our kiwi teachers are as I met about 10 of them in the one school!



Once home, it didn't take long for the reality of my job to hit, with a board meeting, course and 2 days with our **Education Review Office (ERO)** evaluation partners on site last week. ERO were very impressed with their site visit and worked with us to determine our areas of continued improvement as we move into next year. Our ERO partners commented on the quality of leadership and teaching in our school and the visit was very affirming. The staff do a great job to serve our school community and it was nice that this was acknowledged by an external review team. The ERO team will publish a brief report and this should be available to share with the community at some stage next term.

Thanks to the parents who came to our **emergency preparedness** information session on Monday night. It was great to have Whetū from WREMO and our Kindergarten staff/parents along for this. One key message was to make sure you have at least 5 school contacts that could pick your child up in an emergency. We discussed our reunification plan (how we would manage to dismiss children to caregivers/emergency contacts in case of a big emergency) and we will be practising this next year. We would not be able to hand your child over to anyone not on your list. You can view your contact details in the Edge app and if you need to update these, please email <a href="mailto:contactupdates@discovery.school.nz">contactupdates@discovery.school.nz</a>. Please include your emergency contacts name, contact number, address and relationship to your child in the email. Also state if they are additional to the people you have on Edge or if you are replacing them.

Thanks to Nicky Kenny, as well as all the coaches and managers, for their work to support our netball teams. # The Companion Way School Entry Closure - Advance notice

The building work at the back of the school includes a new retaining wall along the end of Room 20. This work will be started in the school holidays, however it will take longer than 2 weeks. Therefore, the Companion Way entrance to school **will be closed from 30 September until 1 November.** It may reopen early if the weather is kind to us. If you use The Companion Way entrance to the school, please get your child to walk down Capstan Lane and connect with the walkway that leads to the back gate on the field or the back entrance. This will ensure we don't add additional traffic to the front of the school.

#### **A Few Important Reminders**

Please remember to park according to the road rules, which means not on yellow lines. It is incredibly frustrating when we continually ask people to abide by the rules, yet we still experience people parking on yellow lines. The bottom line is it causes an unsafe environment for our tamariki. Please also only use the mobility car park if you have a mobility permit and avoid parking behind and blocking vehicles in. The yellow lines through the middle of the car park are not a stop and drop area.

Just a reminder that children can come to school at <u>8:30am</u>. Teachers need time to prepare learning for the day. If you need before school care, please contact Kelly Club.

We have noticed an increase in the number of tired, distracted children in our classrooms. Many have commented that this is due to late night device use. We have also noticed gaming language appearing in written and oral language as well as in actions in the playground. We know that young children won't be playing R Rated games like Fortnite and Call of Duty, but they may be observing older siblings or parents playing. We would like parents to please monitor their children's phone and inappropriate gaming as this has an impact on their learning and relationships at school.

# **School Donations/Annual Charges/Credits**

Thank you to those parents/caregivers who have paid their annual charges/donations for the year.

All school donations are voluntary, but they are a crucial source of funding for our school. Some schools can opt into a scheme where the Ministry of Education funds an additional \$150 per student to the school. Unfortunately, Discovery School is not eligible to access this as it is assumed we can access additional revenue through parent donations. Discovery School's expenditure budget (in particular our curriculum budget) is prepared on the basis of providing the best possible education outcomes for your child. The reality is we cannot do this without your help. Your donation is spent on staffing to keep our class sizes smaller, curriculum resources such as art paper, physical education gear, mathematics books, library books, computer consumables, lessons with outside providers such as Big Air Gym, subscriptions and musical instruments, all of which are used in the day to day education of your child.

Parent donations are an essential part of ensuring that we resource our school adequately. Without donations many of our wonderful school activities would not be able to proceed. While we understand not all whānau are in a position to pay a donation to the school, we are very grateful to those of you who can assist us through providing a donation.

#### **Musac Edge App - New Feature - Absences (preferred option)**

You can now inform the office of absences via the app and it is super easy. We really encourage parents to use the app for absence notification if you can as it logs directly into the attendance register, which will assist with efficiency and accuracy at our end!

Access to the edge caregiver portal and app uses the existing email address that Discovery School has on record. This App allows you to view school information about your child(ren), notify the school of absences and view and pay school bills online (note there is a small surcharge for credit card payments). It gives you quick and easy access to the information for students in your household. Once you are in, click on 'notify school of absence' and follow the prompts. If your child is away sick, we do need the type of illness/reason noted. If you have any questions, please contact the office. You can also check your contact details and emergency contacts on the App.
