Kia ora e te whānau

It was great to have such high attendance at our **Learning Conversations** last week. We had 97% of tamariki have a learning conversation with their teacher and whānau - this shows great commitment from our school community to ensure our tamariki are well supported in their learning. Thank you for taking the time to attend these meetings. This year, we included ensuring you are clear about your child's attendance rate. If your child has a low attendance rate, they have less chance of success at school. If you need help with increasing your child's attendance - please speak to your child's teacher or a member of our Leadership Team. If you have any feedback about the Learning Conversations, please send it through to me. We are looking at the possibility of moving our reporting from Seesaw to Hero next year. A few of our staff will be trialing the use of Hero for reporting as we move through the next few terms - you won't notice anything different during the trial as we'll do it all behind the scenes, but we'll keep you posted on any developments.

It was lovely to see so many of you come through the staffroom on the Learning Conversation evenings last week - we had 70 families come and share their thoughts with us. **Curriculum** is our main purpose, so getting feedback from whānau about aspects of curriculum delivery is really helpful. If you missed the opportunity to give us feedback, we'll be sending you a survey next week to complete if you are interested as it will help us with our strategic and future planning.

Thanks also to the people who completed our survey a few weeks back about the **relevance of our current strategic goals** moving forward. A summary of the whānau and staff surveys was presented to the board on Monday and <u>can be found here.</u> This information is one piece of information within a wider consultation that will be considered as we develop our strategic plan for the next 3 years.

It's been great to see some nominations coming in for our **board elections**. Information that had previously been sent out can be found later in the newsletter - please remember that nominations close at 12 noon on the 6th of August. Election day is the 10th of September.

End of School Day

We are noticing an increased number of older children not leaving the school grounds at the end of the day and instead, staying around school to play basketball or hang out with friends. Just a reminder that tamariki are to go home after school and should be vacating the grounds by 3.15pm (unless they are in an organised activity such as Kelly Sports or Kelly Club). Once home and back in your care, they are welcome to return to school to play in the playground if they arrange that with you.

Donations

Last term, we sent out information about why our school is so reliant on parent donations as we don't receive the same amount of government funding as some other schools. This is because the government believes we are a school that has a parent community that can and do, pay their school donations. A huge thanks to everyone who has paid all or some of their 2025 school donations. We know things are tight for many families, so we budgeted for 65% of families to pay (\$57,720). We have seen an increase since our last communication about donations, but we are still significantly under our budgeted income with \$38,700 paid - this means we are still \$20,000 under budget. Every little bit helps, so if you are in a position to pay all or some of your donation and haven't yet done so, it would be much appreciated, as we rely on this money for our resources and equipment.

No Nuts at School - Reminder

Discovery School is a nut free school as we have several children who have severe allergic reactions which are life-threatening. Our aim in being nut free is to make the school environment as safe as possible for these children. We have made the request to all parents and caregivers that they omit nut products (for example, peanut butter, peanut cookies, Nutella, muesli bars or satay sauce), from children's lunches. By doing this we aim to avoid the possibility of what is called cross-contamination whereby nuts or nut products may be spread to a child with this allergy.


Many products are marked with the warning that they "may contain traces of nuts". Please note that our request does not apply to these products, but simply to those where nuts constitute an actual ingredient.


Science Fair

WINTERILLNESS

Colds, flu and other respiratory illness are common in schools during winter. Here are some simple tips to prevent the spread of illness:

 Wash and dry hands regularly, especially after blowing your nose, coughing, sneezing, and using the toilet



- Cough and sneeze into a tissue or your elbow, not your hand
- Regularly clean high touch surfaces door handles, taps, table tops, phones, computer keyboards, etc
- You should keep your child at home from school if they are too sick to learn and need time to rest and recover
- Get a flu jab NOW it's FREE for people who are pregnant, over 65s, and people at higher risk of getting very sick. Check with your healthcare provider to see if you are eligible
