Kia ora e te whānau

Welcome to Term 4 which is always a busy time of year for us as we continue offering high quality teaching and learning, while also planning for next year. The term will fly by!

Thanks to everyone and the DSPTA (who need your help)

I'd like to start with a huge thanks to everyone who supported the DSPTA's chocolate fundraiser last term. This made over \$8,000! These funds go directly towards enhancing school resources and supporting student activities as we plan for 2026. We're so grateful for the enthusiasm and generosity shown by our school community for this fundraiser, and the amazing raffle items that have been kindly donated for this term's raffle fundraiser.

The DSPTA is a small group of parents and teachers who work together to create community events and fundraisers like the upcoming Discover Christmas, but they need your help. They are looking for some new members to share the load... there are many different ways you can help so please check out their details and how you can contact them later in the newsletter.

School Attendance

I want to share some important information with you regarding student attendance, following the recent report from the Education Review Office (ERO). The ERO report highlighted that while overall attendance is improving, there is an ongoing finding about the impact of parental decisions on attendance. The good news is that parents overwhelmingly understand the importance of their children not missing school. However, the report also pointed out that for a range of reasons, this understanding doesn't always translate into a commitment to daily attendance. Specifically, the ERO noted the high numbers of students being taken out of school for term-time holidays and the documented impact this can have on long-term progress and achievement.

I completely understand that costs for airfares and family trips are often significantly lower during the school term—a reality every teacher in New Zealand is very familiar with! However, we are seeing the direct impact here at school. For example, this week we have had more students away on holiday than due to sickness (e.g., yesterday, 15 students on holiday compared to 7 away due to illness). When students are away, even for a short time, it can disrupt their learning momentum, their progress and achievement, and their social interactions. If your child has already had multiple term-time breaks over their time at Discovery School, I

encourage you to carefully consider the cumulative effect on their learning journey. We are partners in your child's education, and we share this information to ensure every student has the best chance to succeed.

We were advised by the Ministry of Education last term that we have been allocated staffing for a Learning Support Teacher from next year. This is a permanent part time position that will significantly boost the resource in our school for students who require support with learning and extension. This also benefits all children as teachers will be better supported to cater for diverse learning needs.

Thank you for your support with the changes to our cell phone procedures I advised you of a few weeks ago. The new processes are working well.

Classes for next year

We are currently determining class structures for next year. This is never an easy job as each year group differs in size, ranging from 51-70 students! We have considered different options and are finalising one that best meets the needs of all learners. I will provide the class structure to you towards the end of term. In the meantime, we are beginning the planning process for class placements. When placing students in classes, we make every effort to ensure classes are well balanced (gender, ability, social/emotional and academic needs), as well as ensuring students are placed with others who they work well with. It is worth noting they do not always work to their full potential alongside their best friends! We aim to place students in classes where they can be catered for effectively, where they will be happy and well matched to teacher strengths. I acknowledge that parents can have information about their child that we may not be aware of and this can support us in making effective class placements. There is an opportunity between now and Monday 27 October to advise me in writing of anything that might be helpful in compiling class lists. I ask that you email me directly kmacnee@discovery.school.nz (as opposed to talking to teachers or other staff). Please include the educational reasoning behind the information you are sharing with me. The reason I ask you to email or write to me directly is to ensure I receive all the information, and nothing gets 'lost in translation'. If you have given us this information last year and you feel it is still relevant, or if you have spoken with a teacher during the year please still email me with the information. We will then use this information to assist us in making placements.

Please note that there are a range of factors to consider in this process and I cannot guarantee to accommodate all specific requests, rather we will consider them alongside other factors. What one parent might suggest could be cancelled out by the needs of other children/classes or teacher objective knowledge. Our timeframe for class placements is tight, therefore I ask that you meet the deadline above. Unfortunately it is likely to be too late to consider any information coming in after this date.

This is also the time of the year when some families move out of the area. If your child is not going to be returning in 2026, please email me kmacnee@discovery.school.nz as soon as possible to let me know.

Thank you to those who voted in our recent board election and those parents who stood for election. Our school is very fortunate to have such a high level of interest in becoming a board member. Donations

Last term, we sent out information about why our school is so reliant on parent donations as we don't receive the same amount of government funding as some other schools. This is because the government believes we are a school that has a parent community that can and do, pay their school donations. A huge thanks to everyone who has paid all or some of their 2025 school donations. We know things are tight for many families, so we budgeted for 65% of families to pay (\$57,720). We have seen an increase since our last communication about donations, which we are very grateful for. Unfortunately we are still under our budgeted income with \$46,602 paid - this means we are still just over \$11,000 under budget. Every little bit helps, so if you are in a position to pay all or some of your donation and haven't yet done so, it would be much appreciated, as we rely on this money for our resources and equipment. Please also consider paying your technology (Year 7/8) and Mathletics (Year 4-6) donations if you haven't already.



MEASLES

Measles is one of the most dangerous and contagious diseases. If you are not vaccinated and come into contact with someone who has it, you are very likely to catch it and pass it on to others.



Measles can cause a rash, flu-like symptoms, or more serious problems like brain swelling, chest infections, or death.

The best prevention is two MMR vaccinations. The MMR vaccine protects against 3 viral infections — measles, mumps and rubella. If you are unsure how many your family have had, check with your healthcare provider. Vaccines are free for tamariki and adults who have not had two doses.
