Health And Safety

The turf installer has suggested an additional \$10,000 for a rubber underlay. We discussed the impact on our finances if we don't get a grant and would like more information.

Swimming Pool Insurance

There has been a significant increase in the cost to insure the pool. The board agreed that we do not need to insure the pool based on advice from the Ministry. If we cancel now, Ally Todd can save the additional insurance costs and insure anything they wish to have insured directly with their own provider.
