Technology

If for some reason students are running late, they need to be taken to Brandon Intermediate and delivered to the office.


Students must wear closed covered shoes for Tech (no Crocs or Birks) and long hair needs to be tied back.

Classes finish at 12:30 and students return to Discovery School by 12:50.

Tech begins for 2026 on Wednesday, 11th February and students will be in year level groups while at Brandon.

There is an annual charge from Brandon Intermediate of \$80 to cover the use of materials. This needs to be paid to the Discovery School office by the end of term 1 please.

A receipt will be issued and you can claim part of this donation back through the I.R.D. Bus costs are funded by the Ministry of Education.



Leaving the School Grounds

From time to time, students leave the school grounds and walk to the local park to play sports or to further their learning outside the classroom. They will also leave the school grounds as part of cross country training in term 2.

Parents will always be made aware when these activities are taking place. RAMs (Risk Management forms) will be completed by the syndicate leader and signed off by the Principal.

Misused phones will be held in a locked cupboard in the Principal's office. They must be collected by a parent.


It is important that Chromebooks come to school ready to use, i.e. at least 75%. We don't have the capacity to charge devices in each room.

Merits / School Badge

4-5 times each term, senior syndicate children will be competing in a syndicate challenge called "The Golden Gumboot." The challenges include a range of activities, such as singing, relays, tug of war, Maths games, design challenges, brain teasers, football matches..

Term 1 learning opportunities



Mathematics / Numeracy

Our students will begin the year focusing on rational numbers; adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing large and decimal numbers. They will learn knowledge and strategies needed to solve problems. They will focus on basic facts and place value of numbers.

Literacy

Our main focus will be reading and writing biographies.


They will complete follow up activities that relate to texts and they will also complete shared reading activities, listen to class stories and visit the school library.

They will learn spelling rules, grammar conventions and they will complete activities in a structured literacy approach.

Topic/Inquiry and Health: Relationships

We will begin the term by focusing on creating positive classroom environments and getting to know each other. Students will aim to build relationships with others in their class and the wider syndicate and learn what successful collaboration looks and feels like. We will spend time learning about and focusing on our school values which are Excellence, Responsibility, Respect and Integrity.

Life Education in the mobile classroom is booked to start in week 7 on Monday, 16th March.



Nutrition lessons: Nova is a nutritionist who will be working with our seniors about making healthy decisions about food. These lessons will take place in week 6 and are free for our tamariki.

St Johns: Jel from St John's will be coming to Discovery School to work with our seniors about health and well being. These sessions are also free.

Students will also be completing a unit about puberty. **The focus of this unit is about changes to the body during adolescence.**

We follow various Ministry of Education resources which we will share with you prior to starting the lessons.

Physical Education

During term 1, our focus will be on small ball skills and games.

P.E. is an important part of our programme. If a student is unable to participate due to injury, they need a note from a caregiver/parent. Sick children need to stay at home please.

**Students need to come to school with sports shoes each day please.
At this age level, a change of t-shirt and/or use of deodorant is encouraged.**

Languages / Te Reo Māori

Throughout the year, students will learn international languages in year level groups. **They will spend a term learning each of the following:**

French with Sarah Jenner
Japanese with Nic Kibblewhite
Italian with Shaun Bishop
NZ Sign Language with Stacey Mew

We aim to integrate Te Reo Māori into our daily programmes. During term 1, we will focus on greetings, commands, learning new whakatauki, Karakia and waiata. We begin our mornings with a 'mihi o te ata' during which we aim to speak only te reo Māori. We believe that it is important for all of our students to learn te reo because it is one of New Zealand's official languages.

Homework

We run a daily home learning programme. Children are expected to spend time each day/evening completing maths tasks, reading a book and doing an assignment task. We appreciate your support with this. Further information will follow about homework soon.
