Term 2 learning opportunities in the Senior Team

Mathematics



To begin the term, our students will be completing a <u>multiplication and division</u> unit. The purpose of this unit is to learn strategies to solve more complex multiplication and division problems (such as with large numbers, fractions and decimals).

Later in the term, we will also be completing a <u>measurement</u> unit about length and area, perimeter, volume, capacity and temperature.

Throughout the term, we will continue to focus on basic facts and place value, as well as maintenance of previously taught concepts.

Literacy



We will be learning to write <u>scientific reports</u>. This links to our major Science Inquiry.

Students will complete reading and related follow up activities that link to the science topic. They will listen to class stories and visit the school library.

They will continue learning spelling rules and grammar conventions.



Our major topic/inquiry unit is to prepare for the school Science Fair.

During this unit, students will complete rotations around the senior classrooms, learning various scientific concepts with each teacher.

Then they will complete an investigation in a small group. We would like to invite you to view their science displays in the school hall on Tuesday, 24th June (week 9) between 8am and 9am.

P.E. and Health



Early in the term, we will be focusing on <u>cross country</u> running. This will involve students training at least three times per week. They will leave the school grounds to do this to complete a 'low course' around the outside of the school or a 'high course' which involves some hill climbing. We also offer a fitness circuit as an option. Our aim is for all children to be active, regardless of whether they like to run competitively or not!

Please send an email (prior to class starting so teachers see it) or write a note to your child's teacher if they are injured and unable to train. It is important that students bring sports shoes and wear appropriate clothing for daily P.E. sessions.

Later in the term (and in term 3), we will focus on <u>winter sports</u>, such as netball, hockey, rugby, basketball and football.
